She regularly meets with them to encourage, support, and guide them through the journey of medical school. ATOMA salutes Dr. and Mrs. Baker for their support and commitment to ATOMA and its mission.



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Let us not forget those who invested many, many hours as well money to help us accomplish our mission. We celebrate our rich heritage, and we also look forward to the bright future of ATOMA. So what is the future of ATOMA? With the help of the ATOMA officers, committee chairs, and members, I envision ATOMA as a recognizable and relevant force that



will make people want to be part of that movement. For this upcoming year, I have three goals I'd like to see ATOMA accomplish.

1. Support our osteopathic physicians. The first and most important goal is to continue supporting our osteopathic physicians. One way we can support our physicians is to study state and federal legislation that affects health care. Individually, we can take an active part in the legislative process, with our time and our votes. The MD idea at TCOM did not ultimately come up in the 2011 legislative session; no bill was introduced to change the law. But every indication is that they will try again in the 2013 legislative session.

We can help with that issue by staying in touch with our legislators and keeping them informed about new initiatives and changes that make any consideration of an MD program at TCOM even less appealing now and a waste of funds. We can tell our legislators that the focus should be expanding Graduate Medical Education (GME) in the state to keep our doctors in Texas. It is extremely important for TOMA and ATOMA members to unite and cultivate a relationship with our Senator and Representative. I also encourage all of us to attend Dome Day on February 27, 2012, in Austin, Texas, and make our voices heard.

2. Grow our membership. Our second goal is to grow our membership by building relationships. I'd like to see us triple ATOMA membership so that we will be three times as effective in our efforts on behalf of the osteopathic profession in Texas. We can do this by cultivating relationships at the local level within the districts. By doing this, I am confident we can build up our organization. I would like to locate and name at least one contact person per district. I will keep that contact person informed on all activities of ATOMA so that that person may report back his or her district. And we want to hear what the districts are doing and report all their activities back to ATOMA. In addition, we would like to see an increase in our physician members. Physicians don't necessarily have to attend meetings, hold offices or join committees unless it is their choice. What we are looking for are a unity of friends to meet, share and bond as members of our Texas Osteopathic Family. If you currently are a member of ATOMA, I

want to thank you for your membership. We are a charitable organization, and your financial support allows us to provide scholarships to TCOM medical students, donate white coats to all incoming students, support the Student Advocate Association at TCOM, and much more. Finally, in order to grow our membership, we must continue to support the Student Advocate Association. This group is our future. I think we currently do an excellent job supporting the SAA.

3. Participate in public health projects. Our third and final goal is to create a better understanding of osteopathic medicine by participating in public health programs in our communities. I will be leading ATOMA on a project that is near and dear to our hearts. As you may know, we lost Linda Cole this past spring after she battled with colon cancer. Linda was highly involved as an advocate, serving as both ATOMA President and AAOA President. In remembrance of Linda, ATOMA will join forces with TOMA physicians to launch a public education project about preventing colorectal cancer through screening and early detection. We will assist in establishing the grass roots of this project by helping physicians gain access free patient materials. We will also provide speaker training at the Mid-winter conference.

To conclude, I ask that you all please join me as we continue to grow as an osteopathic family. I am confident we can join together and achieve these goals I described today. Thank you again for this great opportunity to serve as your President. I look forward to a great year!
